Dear Friends in Christ,

Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character (such as Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter), there remains in the yearly cycle those weeks (33 or 34) that do not celebrate a specific mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on Sundays, they are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its fullness. This period is known as **Ordinary Time**. (The term "ordinary" does not refer to "usual, customary, not exceptional" but rather comes from the word "ordinal" meaning "numbered," for these weeks are ordered by number one after the other.) We began Ordinary Time this past Tuesday, for the Christmas Season concluded with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord on Monday. Ordinary Time continues through Tuesday, February 28th, the day before Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Lenten Season. Ordinary Time will resume when Easter Season ends, that is, on June 5th, the day following Pentecost.

Last Sunday afternoon as I went with a group of 5 parishioners to celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick with our homebound parishioners I was reminded once again of the importance of being connected to a community of faith, what we call "church". Each person we prayed with was so happy to see us, and I could see they felt connected to the wider Church through us. We brought Christ to them, we served Christ living in them, and they opened our eyes to how we are all one body in Christ.

The Catholic Church throughout the U.S. just completed "National Migration Week" (Jan. 8-14). The United States Catholic Conference of Bishops (USCCB) sponsored this week of prayer and reflection. As the U.S. bishops wrote with their brother bishops from Mexico in the pastoral letter, *Strangers No Longer, Together on the Journey of Hope*: "From its founding to the present, the United States remains a nation of immigrants grounded in the firm belief that newcomers offer energy, hope and cultural diversity. Our common faith in Jesus Christ moves us to search for ways that favor a spirit of solidarity. It is a faith that transcends borders and bids us to overcome all forms of discrimination and violence so that we may build relationships that are just and loving." I would say that this call to solidarity is needed more than ever in today's climate of fear of the stranger.

The annual "Sanctity of Life" Mass and program will take place at the Cathedral this Wednesday evening beginning with Mass at 6 p.m. The "Week of Prayer for Christian Unity" also begins this Wednesday.

Another in the series of Virginia Campbell concerts takes place this afternoon at 3 p.m. in our church with Amy Cheng performing on our piano. Bring your bulletin for free admission.

The Parish Office will be closed tomorrow (Monday) on Martin Luther King Day. I am leaving on vacation this Friday, January 20 and will be back in the office on Friday morning, January 27th. Fr. Ross will be here in my absence.
