PASTORAL SHARINGS

Dear Friends in Christ,

Another Christmas Season has come and gone as the trees and wreaths and multitude of poinsettias have been removed from the church. Thanks to Marie Downey and her helpers who decorated the gathering area and church so beautifully, and thanks to all the liturgical ministers who made this Christmas Season a time of such wonderful worship. Also, thanks to those of you who brought so many gifts by the rectory or sent them via mail.

The spirit of Christmas inspired many of you to respond generously to the needs of our brothers and sisters suffering from the effects of the tsunami. Over \$26,000 was given in our special 2nd collections during the first two weekends of January. The generosity of our parishioners never ceases to amaze me. The gift from our parish will be joined to gifts from other parishes, along with a donation from our archdiocese, and one large check sent to Catholic Relief Services.

This Saturday, Jan. 22nd, marks the thirty-second anniversary of the Supreme Court decision, Roe vs. Wade, which legalized abortion in the U.S. The USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) calls for Jan. 22nd to be observed as a particular day of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion and of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life. **We will have Mass at 9 a.m. Saturday morning in observance of this**

special day of prayer. As for acts of penance, one could volunteer to help out at Birth Choice or make a donation to their work (636-4347 or www.birth-choice.org), or contact Susan Givens about the needs of Project Gabriel in our parish. As for fasting, cutting back on food is meant to make us one with the poor, to stand in solidarity with those in need who have no voice. The child in the womb has no voice, and often times, a pregnant mother in a problem pregnancy with no one to support her or her child feels powerless as well. To be pro-life means not only helping the mother in a problem pregnancy have her child but also caring for that child after it is born all the way to a natural death—providing food, shelter, healthcare, and all the rights that come from being human.

Archbishop Beltran will celebrate a special Mass on Martin Luther King Day, Monday, January 17th, at 12 noon at Corpus Christi Catholic Church. Following up on last Sunday's focus on religious and priestly vocations, there are prayer cards for vocations and a pamphlet entitled "Is God Calling You" on the table in the gathering area. Also, thanks to those of you who came forward to help pay for the renovation of the gathering area---the \$20,000 goal has been attained.

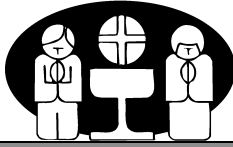

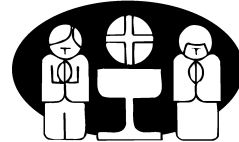
