Dear Friends in Christ,

This Sunday, January 22nd, is the 33rd anniversary of the legalization of abortion in our land. Tomorrow (Monday) all dioceses in the U.S. are asked to observe a "day of penance for the violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion, and prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life." (General Instruction on the Roman Missal, #373). As you do penance and pray on Monday, please also pray that the life of every human person will be respected and honored as created in God's image: the elderly or severely ill person at risk of assisted suicide, children who go hungry, men and women on death row, and immigrants coming here from other lands.

The Catholic Church not only preaches against abortion, but also does everything possible to help women during their pregnancy and afterwards to raise their children. The social teachings of our Church challenge us to care for children who are born in difficult circumstances by working for just wages for their parents, advocating for affordable health care, as well as promoting safety nets to support the most vulnerable. Through Project Gabriel at our parish, and at other parishes, women in crisis pregnancies are given assistance that they need. The Holy Family Home in Midwest City, one of the ministries of Catholic Charities, houses teenagers who are pregnant and who have nowhere else to turn. The Office of Family Life at the Catholic Pastoral Center offers Rachel's Vineyard retreats for women and men who are seeking healing from the effects of going through an abortion. Every Mother's Day there is a special collection for Birth Choice. Our youth group will be collecting gifts this weekend and next weekend for Birth Choice (clothes, baby supplies, cash donations, etc). Earlier this month a new abbot was elected to lead the Benedictine community at St. Gregory's in Shawnee. Fr. Lawrence Stasyszen is now Abbot Lawrence. Many of you know Abbot Lawrence through his position as President of St. Gregory's University and his annual visits to our parish to ask for donations for that school's scholarship fund. There are 29 monks at St. Gregory's, about 1/2 the number of 30 years ago. Please keep Abbot Lawrence in your prayers as he enters into this new position of leadership, especially since he will also continue to serve as President of St. Gregory's University.

The Catholic Foundation of Oklahoma will award a number of scholarships to Catholic students enrolled or planning to enroll full-time at a college or university for the 2006-2007 academic year. Included in these scholarship offers are also medical scholarships to the School of Medicine at OU and a Nursing Scholarship.
