Dear Friends in Christ,

One of the ways our parish reaches out to those who suffer through the death of a loved one is by offering a dinner after the funeral service. These funeral dinners provide family members and good friends not only with a delicious meal but also the opportunity to gather in fellowship and support during a difficult time. Jeanne Ann Van Horn is the coordinator of this ministry in our parish. Jeanne Ann has informed me that she needs more volunteers to help serve these funeral dinners. Our Archdiocese recently released revised guidelines for marriage preparation on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Advent, November 28, 2004. These guidelines were printed in the Archdiocesan newspaper, *The Sooner Catholic*. One of the changes has been the extension of the required time for preparation from 4 months to 6 months. If you or someone you know is planning on getting married in the Church, please inform them of this change so they will be able to contact their parish priest within the allotted time required. This change will soon be reflected on the front of the Sunday bulletin under "Matrimony."

This weekend after the 5 p.m. Saturday Mass there will be a reception for English-speaking newcomers to our parish, and after the 12 noon Mass on Sunday there will be another reception for Spanish-speaking newcomers. The Newcomers Committee, under the direction of Duane Hogsett, will be in charge of these receptions. This Committee has been working on other ways to help newcomers to our parish feel welcome here. Actually, this ministry is the responsibility of every one of us. If you notice someone you do not know sitting next to you at Mass or standing alone in the gathering area, introduce yourself and welcome them.

Our Confirmation II students are on retreat this weekend. Please keep them in your prayers. This will be their last retreat before they receive the Sacrament of Confirmation on April 22<sup>nd</sup>. Next weekend at each Mass a lay person will speak about the importance of supporting the upcoming Annual ADF Appeal, which takes place on Feb. 5-6. You should receive brochures this weekend detailing the good works that this Annual Archdiocesan Appeal supports. Our local Knights of Columbus Council hosts their annual Mardi Gras party this coming Saturday evening, Jan. 29<sup>th</sup>. Thanks to those Knights who put up the Christmas lights outdoors and who recently took those same lights down.

Fr. Ross will be gone on vacation from Sunday afternoon, January 23 – Saturday, February 5<sup>th</sup>. Thus, there will be Communion Services on the next two Monday mornings (Jan. 24<sup>th</sup> and Jan. 31<sup>st</sup>) instead of the usual morning Mass.

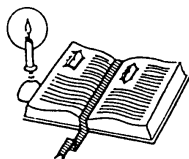
