Dear Friends in Christ,

Today kicks off "Catholic Schools Week" throughout the U.S. Catholic education has been one of the major ministries of the Catholic Church in the U.S. and has been an important ministry for our parish these past 46 years. (Our school was opened in 1959, one year after the founding of our parish in 1958.) Our parish school has 381 students enrolled from the 3-year-old class through 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Our principal, Mrs. Suzette Williams, and the school faculty and staff strive to teach by word and example about the love of God, following the example of Christ the Teacher. Our school parents are also very involved in the life of the school. Our schoolchildren keep Christ in their vision through daily communal prayer, good works and learning. A School Mass is celebrated every Thursday morning. At this Mass the schoolchildren and others in attendance donate money to support the work of Fr. John Bosco who oversees Holy Family Home for orphaned children in Nigeria. This School Mass collection in the first semester totaled \$2118 to help these children who are in great need.

The cost of Catholic Education continues to rise each year. Desiring to keep Catholic Education affordable, our parish established a School Scholarship Endowment Fund a couple of years ago. A special collection is taken up on the first Sunday of the month for this fund. The goal is to grow this fund until the interest can be used to provide tuition assistance, which is currently being provided out of general parish operating income. Presently this endowment fund has a balance of about \$140,000.

A little over a year ago our parish also established a Catholic High School Scholarship Fund, which presently has almost \$24,000 in it. \$1000 and \$500 scholarships are given to deserving parishioners who are attending either Mt. St. Mary in south OKC or Bishop McGuinness High School in north OKC. This year our parish has 55 students attending a Catholic High School and almost all of these attend McGuinness.

Next Sunday is our annual ADF Appeal. Brochures explaining this year's Archdiocesan Appeal, entitled "You are the Light of the World," can be found at all the exits. Your gifts to ADF make possible the many services provided by our Archdiocese, including Religious Education, Evangelization, Youth and Young Adult Ministry, and Family Life programs.

Parish volunteers--do not forget about the party being held in your honor at 6 p.m. this Saturday evening, Feb. 5<sup>th</sup> in our Fellowship Hall. You and your family are invited. Jerry and Carol Anne Rakosky have transferred to our parish. They are the parents of Michelle Pierce, one of our parishioners. **National Appreciation Day For Catholic Schools  
Observed February 2**

"**Faith in Every Student: Catholic Schools**" is the theme of Catholic Schools Week 2005. The week runs from **January 30 to February 5** in Catholic schools throughout the nation and was launched 31 years ago. The observance begins on the last Sunday in January every year.

**National Appreciation Day For Catholic Schools will be observed Wednesday, February 2. Two other highlights of the week are National Appreciation Day For Catholic School Teachers, a tribute to the 163,000 Catholic educators, observed February 4 and, new this year, Vocation Appreciation Day, on February 3.** The latter was established to recognize the leadership of religious orders and clergy in serving Catholic education and to encourage others to follow in their footsteps.

The logo for the campaign features a student whose stance and outstretched arms cast the shadow of a cross. The message "Faith in Every Student: Catholic Schools" is featured on the design.

Dominican Sister Glenn Anne McPhee, secretary for education at USCCB, said that the theme of "Faith in Every Student" underscores two guiding principles of Catholic education--the fact that faith is an important value at the foundation of a Catholic school curriculum and that Catholic schools have faith that every student can achieve.

**The purpose of Catholic Schools Week is to build support and recognition for the almost 8,000 Catholic schools nationwide.** During this week, many dioceses encourage parents to enroll their children in Catholic schools. CSW also is an opportunity to interest citizens in volunteering their time and talents to local Catholic schools.
