Dear Friends in Christ,

Archbishop Beltran will speak to us by means of videotape today about the Annual Archdiocesan Appeal. This annual appeal funds about ½ of the operating expense of our Archdiocese. The other ½ of the funds come from parish assessments---each parish is taxed a certain amount according to their income and expenses---and from Archdiocesan investments.

Lent begins this Wednesday as we receive ashes reminding us of life's brevity and the urgent need to turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel. During Lent we make an earnest attempt to deepen and strengthen our faith life, and one such opportunity would be joining one of the Lenten small groups studying "Eucharist: Source and Summit." There are many different times offered for these small group gatherings---sign up after Mass in the gathering area or contact Judi Wilkinson at extension 115.

Speaking of the Eucharist, you will notice a small change in the Mass beginning with the first Sunday of Lent. The Communion cups will be placed on the altar during the Preparation of the Altar, and the wine will be poured into them at this time. This change comes about because the Congregation for Worship of the Holy See has been concerned about the possibility of spillage of the Blood of Christ when it is poured into the cups during the Lamb of God. Also, there was a concern expressed about the fragility of the large, glass flagons and the fear that they might accidentally be broken. On another liturgical note, the lay speakers on ADF last weekend did not speak from the ambo but rather used the cantor's mike. The ambo is to be reserved only for the reading of the Word of God and preaching.

You may have noticed the windows in the large doors down the hallway to the west of the gathering area. Windows were added to these doors for safety reasons. When the doors were solid, it was hard to see people on the other side of the doors. Children were most at a risk of getting hit by a quick-opening door, especially our 4-year old schoolchildren who use these doors frequently during the school day. Thanks to Jack Holland for the good work he did in renovating these doors, and to Mike Muckleroy for helping take down and then reinstall these large doors.

As I mentioned in last week's bulletin, Jerry and Carol Anne Rakosky have transferred from St. Monica Parish in Edmond to our parish. Jerry will be helping with the Children's Liturgy of the Word at the 5 p.m. Mass on Saturday, which will begin soon. He will also continue to coordinate the "Labor of Love" service weekends for youth in the OKC area. Jerry and our other deacon candidates---Alejandro Randolph and Stan McKay will be ordained to the permanent diaconate, God willing, in November 2006. Beginning this month, they will be assisting at Mass, especially in preparing the communion cups during the Preparation of the Altar.

Fr. Ross will have an operation on his shoulder to repair rotator cuff damage on Monday, Feb. 7th, so please pray for him.

OUR LENTEN REGULATIONS

Church law considers every Friday and the season of Lent as penitential time. The practice of penance is part of our faith and Christian life. When we do penance, we imitate Jesus Who Himself recommended it as necessary to His followers and gave them the example of His prayer and fasting. The Lenten obligation, as determined for Catholics in the United States by our bishops, requires that **fasting be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The law of abstinence from meat is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.**

Who must fast? All Catholics who are between the ages of 18 and 59. The obligation ceases when one begins his/her 60th year.

Who must abstain? All Catholics who are 14 years and older.

What does fasting mean? The observance of fasting means that those obliged may take only one full meal on the day of fast. Two lighter meals (not equal to another full meal) are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs. Eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

What does abstinence mean? The law of abstinence forbids the eating of meat. Voluntary abstinence refers to refraining from lawful pleasures in a spirit of penance.

Can anyone be dispensed or excused from fast and/or abstinence? Individuals with just cause may be dispensed by a priest. Those who are ill or have a similar serious reason are excused from the observance of fast and abstinence. Catholics are reminded that they should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation. If they do so, they then need to compensate with prayer and other voluntary penance.

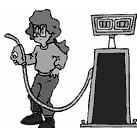
