Dear Friends in Christ,

The "Rite of Sending" is celebrated this weekend at the 5 p.m. and 10 a.m. Masses. After being prayed for and signing the Book of the Elect, our catechumens and candidates will be sent to the Rite of Election at the Cathedral. There Archbishop Beltran, in the name of the Church, will usher them into their new status as the "Elect"—chosen by God for the Easter Sacraments. Photos of our catechumens and candidates are in the gathering area. Please pray for them during this final period of their preparation.

Children's Liturgy of the Word has been taking place at our 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday and will now begin at the 5 p.m. Mass this Saturday, Feb. 12th. Young children are sent forth after the opening prayer with their catechist to listen to the Scripture readings and an appropriate reflection in the chapel. The children usually return to the main church around the time the collection is being taken. Thus, children are nourished by the word of God in a special way, and their parents may find paying attention to the word of God in church easier to do. For the sake of the ushers who seat latecomers, please reserve your child's seat by placing a hymn book in their vacated spot. Also, catechists for Children's Liturgy of the Word are needed at the 5 p.m. Mass—please contact Karen Bernardy, DRE, if interested in this ministry.

Catholic Schools Week was a grace-filled time of celebrating the gift of a Catholic education. The Fine Arts night during that week displayed an incredible amount of artistic and musical talent of our school students. Karen Bernardy was honored as the "Distinguished Alum of the Year" for St. Eugene School. Karen graduated from our school in 1968 and has been a lifetime member of our parish. She served our parish as Coordinator of Youth Ministry for 10 years and for the past 2½ years has been Director of Religious Education. The Public Relations sub-committee of our School Advisory Council has published a beautiful brochure about our school—you can find these on the counter in the gathering area.

The choir area will be undergoing a renovation in the next few weeks. The pews have been removed and placed in the chapel, and the chairs they replaced will be used by choir members. Several parishioners have donated money and materials to make this renovation possible. With the reconfiguration of this space our Director of Music, Brent McWilliams, will be better able to play the organ or piano while simultaneously directing the choir. Also, the choir should be easier to hear as they will be facing the assembly.

As mentioned in the thank-you letter read at Mass last week from the Archbishop, the Archdiocese has collected \$620,000 for the relief effort for the victims of the tsunami. Our parishioners gave \$27,165 toward this cause. Thank you for your generous response.

OUR LENTEN REGULATIONS

Church law considers every Friday and the season of Lent as penitential time. The practice of penance is part of our faith and Christian life. When we do penance, we imitate Jesus Who Himself recommended it as necessary to His followers and gave them the example of His prayer and fasting.

The Lenten obligation, as determined for Catholics in the United States by our bishops, requires that **fasting be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The law of abstinence from meat is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.**

- Who must fast?** All Catholics who are between the ages of 18 and 59. The obligation ceases when one begins his/her 60th year.
- Who must abstain?** All Catholics who are 14 years and older.
- What does fasting mean?** The observance of fasting means that those obliged may take only one full meal on the day of fast. Two lighter meals (not equal to another full meal) are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs. Eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
- What does abstinence mean?** The law of abstinence forbids the eating of meat. Voluntary abstinence refers to refraining from lawful pleasures in a spirit of penance.
- Can anyone be dispensed or excused from fast and/or abstinence?** Individuals with just cause may be dispensed by a priest. Those who are ill or have a similar serious reason are excused from the observance of fast and abstinence. Catholics are reminded that they should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation. If they do so, they then need to compensate with prayer and other voluntary penance.

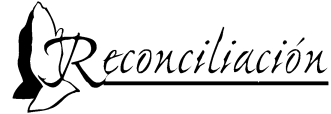

REGLAS DE LA CUARESMA

La ley de la iglesia considera cada viernes y la temporada de Cuaresma como un tiempo de penitencia. La práctica de penitencia es parte de nuestra fe y nuestra vida cristiana. Cuando hacemos penitencia, imitamos a Jesús quién lo recomienda como necesario a sus seguidores y les da el ejemplo de Sus oraciones y abstinencia.

La obligación de la Cuaresma, requiere que se haga ayuno en el miércoles de ceniza y el viernes santo. Abstinencia de carne se debe hacer el miércoles de ceniza y todos los viernes de Cuaresma.

- **Quién tiene que ayunar?** Todos los Católicos entre las edades de 18 y 59 años. Esta termina cuando alguien cumple los 60 años.
- **Quién tiene que abstenerse de comer carne?** Todos los Católicos de 14 años en adelante.
- **Qué significa ayunar?** Ayunar significa que solo puede tener una sola comida fuerte al día. Se permite tomar dos comidas ligeras más durante el día si es necesario para mantener la salud o fuerza física de cada uno. Comer entre comidas no está permitido.
- **Qué significa abstinencia?** Abstinencia significa no comer carne. También dejar de hacer cosas por diversión como espíritu de arrepentimiento.
- **Puede alguien ser excusado del ayuno o la abstinencia?** Alguien que esté enfermo o que tenga alguna razón fuerte pueden ser excusados pero deben compensarlo con oraciones o algún otro tipo de abstinencia.
