Dear Friends in Christ,

The Parish Census Committee met for the first time on Tuesday, February 8th.

If you are interested in helping with this committee, contact the chairperson, Sue Neuberger, at 749-8499. This census is the next step in our process of building a new church. The questionnaire will be mailed in the first week of March.

Two reasons that are often given for the need for a new church: the need for a larger church that will seat more people and the need for a building that is built as a church. (Our present church was built to function as a parish hall and serve as a temporary church.) But a third reason is becoming more evident---the need to free up the present church space as a parish hall that can also be divided into meeting rooms. Carol Ann Combs, our business manager, does an excellent job in overseeing the parish calendar. However, each year scheduling meetings and events becomes more difficult because there is not enough space for all the activities that go on in our lively parish. The first meeting of the Parish Census Committee took place in the parish office in a makeshift setting because there was no other place to meet that night. Also, last week a family of six came to plan a funeral with me, and since all the meeting rooms were occupied with luncheon meetings, I asked the Carmelite Sisters to leave their office for an hour so we could use their space. Fortunately, they did not have any pressing appointments or meetings at that time. (We need a board room for funeral planning meetings, staff meetings, etc.)

This Thursday night, Feb. 24th, @ 7 p.m., Michael Reardon will present the "Gospel of Matthew." There is no way I can explain how powerful and faith-filled this presentation of the Gospel is---you just have to experience it in person. Jesus' teaching and life come alive in a whole new way through this dramatic presentation of Scripture. Make this event one of your Lenten practices. Also, Sat. night, Feb. 26th, is our annual **Friends of Bolivia Dinner and Auction**. Your support is vital in sustaining our annual Medical Mission which brings healing and hope to some of the most impoverished people in the world. What a great way to practice almsgiving during this Lenten Season. There are photos of previous mission trips in the gathering area and tickets will be on sale after the Masses this weekend.

Calling all men who are interested in learning more about their faith and strengthening their relationship with the Lord in the company of other faith-filled men---the 9th Annual Men's Conference at Bishop McGuinness High School on Sat., March 5th is for you. Pamphlets are available on the counter in the gathering area giving more details about this conference.

Thank you to the 350 parish donors who have pledged \$92,615 toward this year's Annual Archdiocesan Appeal. Help our parish reach its goal of \$115,000 by taking a pledge envelope and committing to support the many good works of the Church of the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City. Our Ash Wednesday collection of \$1902 was sent to help the people of Holy Angels Catholic Church in downtown Oklahoma City. Fr. Ross is back at the parish this weekend, recovering quite well from his shoulder surgery and grateful for all your prayers and support.

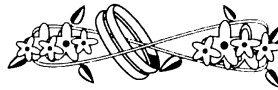

REGLAS DE LA CUARESMA

La ley de la iglesia considera cada viernes y la temporada de Cuaresma como un tiempo de penitencia. La práctica de penitencia es parte de nuestra fe y nuestra vida cristiana. Cuando hacemos penitencia, imitamos a Jesús quien lo recomienda como necesario a sus seguidores y les da el ejemplo de Sus oraciones y abstinencia.

La obligación de la Cuaresma, requiere que se haga ayuno en el miércoles de ceniza y el viernes santo. Abstinencia de carne se debe hacer el miércoles de ceniza y todos los viernes de Cuaresma.

- **Quién tiene que ayunar?** Todos los Católicos entre las edades de 18 y 59 años. Esta termina cuando alguien cumple los 60 años.
- **Quién tiene que abstenerse de comer carne?** Todos los Católicos de 14 años en adelante.
- **Qué significa ayunar?** Ayunar significa que solo puede tener una sola comida fuerte al día. Se permite tomar dos comidas ligeras más durante el día si es necesario para mantener la salud o fuerza física de cada uno. Comer entre comidas no está permitido.
- **Qué significa abstinencia?** Abstinencia significa no comer carne. También dejar de hacer cosas por diversión como espíritu de arrepentimiento.
- **Puede alguien ser excusado del ayuno o la abstinencia?** Alguien que esté enfermo o que tenga alguna razón fuerte pueden ser excusados pero deben compensarlo con oraciones o algún otro tipo de abstinencia.

OUR LENTEN REGULATIONS

Church law considers every Friday and the season of Lent as penitential time. The practice of penance is part of our faith and Christian life. When we do penance, we imitate Jesus Who Himself recommended it as necessary to His followers and gave them the example of His prayer and fasting. The Lenten obligation, as determined for Catholics in the United States by our bishops, requires that **fasting be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The law of abstinence from meat is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.**

- Who must fast?** All Catholics who are between the ages of 18 and 59. The obligation ceases when one begins his/her 60th year.
- Who must abstain?** All Catholics who are 14 years and older.
- What does fasting mean?** The observance of fasting means that those obliged may take only one full meal on the day of fast. Two lighter meals (not equal to another full meal) are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs. Eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
- What does abstinence mean?** The law of abstinence forbids the eating of meat. Voluntary abstinence refers to refraining from lawful pleasures in a spirit of penance.
- Can anyone be dispensed or excused from fast and/or abstinence?** Individuals with just cause may be dispensed by a priest. Those who are ill or have a similar serious reason are excused from the observance of fast and abstinence. Catholics are reminded that they should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation. If they do so, they then need to compensate with prayer and other voluntary penance.
