Dear Friends in Christ,

One good way to practice almsgiving not only during Lent but also throughout the year is by supporting our local **St. Vincent de Paul (SVDP) Conference**. The members of SVDP respond to the material needs of people who live within our parish boundaries, no matter what their faith background. From October 1 – December 31, 2004, SVDP distributed a little over \$10,000 in aid to its clients in need. You can use the monthly SVDP envelope in your envelope packet for monetary donations or place these donations in the SVDP donation box attached to the wall next to the main inner exit from the church. Also, donations of food and other needed materials can be placed in the basket next to the sacristy in the gathering area. If you have clothes or other major items to donate, please take them to the St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Store on the N.W. corner of Meridian and N.W. 10th Street.

Irene Alsobrook stepped down from her leadership position of our local SVDP Conference earlier this year. Irene has been a member of SVDP for 20 years, and has served the past 9 years as President. She has done an outstanding job in leading this important outreach ministry of our parish. Jim Dewitt has stepped forward to become the new President of SVDP. Thanks to Irene for her dedicated service and thanks to Jim and the other members of SVDP for serving Christ in the least of our sisters and brothers.

Steve Voelker helped start our Men's Ministry and Prayer Groups several years ago and has been the leader of this ministry since its inception. He recently passed the mantle of leadership to Jeff Robinson. Thanks to Steve for his leadership in this ministry to the men of our parish.

You probably noticed a new envelope entitled "Youth Mission Trip" in your collection envelope packet for March/April 2005. This monthly envelope replaces the "World Youth Day" envelope. None of our youth registered for the World Youth Day in Germany this year, so the decision was made to change this envelope to reflect a need for support for our annual youth mission trip. For the past couple years our youth have traveled each summer to a major U.S. city to "Catholic Heart Work Camp" to work, play, and pray with Catholic youth from around the country and in the process help people in great need. This summer (June 11-18) our youth will travel to the Twin Cities (Minneapolis/St. Paul) in Minnesota for this faith-filled experience. The total cost per person, including transportation, is around \$500, so any monies that are given through this monthly envelope will be used to defray these costs.

Archbishop Beltran, along with 35 other religious leaders in our State, signed a declaration on Feb. 1st calling for a special day of prayer (Sun., March 6th) for an end to violence against women. Therefore, special prayers will be offered next weekend in this regard and the declaration that our Archbishop signed will be included in next Sunday's bulletin. *In the peace of Christ,*

LENTEN REGULATIONS
Church law considers every Friday and the season of Lent as penitential time. The practice of penance is part of our faith and Christian life. When we do penance, we imitate Jesus Who Himself recommended it as necessary to His followers and gave them the example of His prayer and fasting.
The Lenten obligation, as determined for Catholics in the United States by our bishops, requires that **fasting be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The law of abstinence from meat is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.**

- **Who must fast?** All Catholics who are between the ages of 18 and 59. The obligation ceases when one begins his/her 60th year.
- **Who must abstain?** All Catholics who are 14 years and older.
- **What does fasting mean?** The observance of fasting means that those obliged may take only one full meal on the day of fast. Two lighter meals (not equal to another full meal) are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs. Eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
- **What does abstinence mean?** The law of abstinence forbids the eating of meat. Voluntary abstinence refers to refraining from lawful pleasures in a spirit of penance.
- **Can anyone be dispensed or excused from fast and/or abstinence?** Individuals with just cause may be dispensed by a priest. Those who are ill or have a similar serious reason are excused from the observance of fast and abstinence. Catholics are reminded that they should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation. If they do so, they then need to compensate with prayer and other voluntary penance.

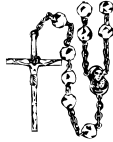

REGLAS DE LA CUARESMA

La ley de la iglesia considera cada viernes y la temporada de Cuaresma como un tiempo de penitencia. La práctica de penitencia es parte de nuestra fe y nuestra vida cristiana. Cuando hacemos penitencia, imitamos a Jesús quién lo recomienda como necesario a sus seguidores y les da el ejemplo de Sus oraciones y abstinencia.

La obligación de la Cuaresma, requiere que se haga ayuno en el miércoles de ceniza y el viernes santo. Abstinencia de carne se debe hacer el miércoles de ceniza y todos los viernes de Cuaresma.

- **Quién tiene que ayunar?** Todos los Católicos entre las edades de 18 y 59 años. Esta termina cuando alguien cumple los 60 años.
- **Quién tiene que abstenerse de comer carne?** Todos los Católicos de 14 años en adelante.
- **Qué significa ayunar?** Ayunar significa que solo puede tener una sola comida fuerte al día. Se permite tomar dos comidas ligeras más durante el día si es necesario para mantener la salud o fuerza física de cada uno. Comer entre comidas no está permitido.
- **Qué significa abstinencia?** Abstinencia significa no comer carne. También dejar de hacer cosas por diversión como espíritu de arrepentimiento.
- **Puede alguien ser excusado del ayuno o la abstinencia?** Alguien que esté enfermo o que tenga alguna razón fuerte pueden ser excusados pero deben compensarlo con oraciones o algún otro tipo de abstinencia.
