Dear Friends in Christ,

One of the three important spiritual practices that the Church encourages us to strengthen during the 40 days of Lent is our **prayer** life. One powerful way to pray is to intercede for others. In this bulletin you will find information about praying the rosary during Lent for our soldiers who are serving in Iraq and Afghanistan. You will also find the names of parishioners, or relatives of parishioners, who are currently serving in Iraq or Afghanistan, so you can include their names in your daily prayers. Also, please pray for our catechumens and candidates and those Catholics who will be confirmed at the Easter Vigil. Their photos and names are on an easel in the gathering area.

The two other Lenten practices--**fasting and almsgiving**—are connected to prayer and integrally related to each other. A vibrant prayer life enables us to hear what God hears—the cries of those who suffer--and strengthens us to bring God's healing love to their lives by sharing our gifts. Fasting connects us with many people in the world who go to bed hungry, and our giving of alms helps ease their pain. In the Feb. 23, 2006 issue of the *Daily Oklahoman*, an article entitled *25 Million hungry were fed in 2005* described how hunger is on the rise in the U.S. "25 million Americans turned to the nation's largest network of food banks, soup kitchens and shelters for meals last year, up 9 percent from 2001. Those seeking food included 9 million children and 3 million senior citizens.... 36 percent of people seeking food came from households in which at least one person had a job."

Our parish is starting a program of assessment and renewal to see what areas need to be improved and what new programs need to be introduced to better serve our parish community. **Within the next week some of you will be receiving an opinion survey.** It will ask your assessment of the parish, as well as other opinions and desires you might have. Please be as candid and forthright as possible. No one from the parish will see your response. All returns will be sent unopened to the Parish Evaluation Project, Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Not everyone will receive a survey. The names will be picked at random from the parish files by means of a computer list of random numbers. It is possible then that both a husband and wife will each receive a survey. I ask that the one to whom the envelope is addressed fill out the survey. The results will be more reliable that way. **This survey is in preparation for the two-week visit of the Parish Assessment and Renewal team in September.** Please pray for the success of this new parish venture.

The accreditation visit for our parish school, which happens every 7 years, takes place this Wednesday thru Friday. Our school faculty, staff, and administration have spent many hours this school year in preparation for this visit. Last Sunday Carol Ann Combs, our business manager, celebrated 10 years of service on our parish staff. Carol Ann has been a great asset to our parish. Please pray for JoAnn Neihart, the rectory cook and housekeeper, who will have knee replacement surgery Tuesday.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Church law considers every Friday and the season of Lent as penitential time. The practice of penance is part of our faith and Christian life. When we do penance, we imitate Jesus Who Himself recommended it as necessary to His followers and gave them the example of His prayer and fasting.

The Lenten obligation, as determined for Catholics in the United States by our bishops, requires that **fasting be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The law of abstinence from meat is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.**

- **Who must fast?** All Catholics who are between the ages of 18 and 59. The obligation ceases when one begins his/her 60th year.
- **Who must abstain?** All Catholics who are 14 years and older.
- **What does fasting mean?** The observance of fasting means that those obliged may take only one full meal on the day of fast. Two lighter meals (not equal to another full meal) are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs. Eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
- **What does abstinence mean?** The law of abstinence forbids the eating of meat. Voluntary abstinence refers to refraining from lawful pleasures in a spirit of penance.
- **Can anyone be dispensed or excused from fast and/or abstinence?** Individuals with just cause may be dispensed by a priest. Those who are ill or have a similar serious reason are excused from the observance of fast and abstinence. Catholics are reminded that they should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation. If they do so, they then need to compensate with prayer and other voluntary penance.

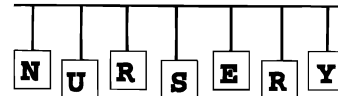

REGLAS DE LA CUARESMA

La ley de la iglesia considera cada viernes y la temporada de Cuaresma como un tiempo de penitencia. La práctica de penitencia es parte de nuestra fe y nuestra vida cristiana. Cuando hacemos penitencia, imitamos a Jesús quién lo recomienda como necesario a sus seguidores y les da el ejemplo de Sus oraciones y abstinencia. **La obligación de la Cuaresma, requiere que se haga ayuno en el miércoles de ceniza y el viernes santo. Abstinencia de carne se debe hacer el miércoles de ceniza y todos los viernes de Cuaresma.**

- **Quién tiene que ayunar?** Todos los católicos entre las edades de 18 y 59 años. Esta termina cuando alguien cumple los 60 años.
- **Quién tiene que abstenerse de comer carne?** Todos los católicos de 14 años en adelante.
- **Qué significa ayunar?** Ayunar significa que solo puede tener una sola comida fuerte al día. Se permite tomar dos comidas ligeras más durante el día si es necesario para mantener la salud o fuerza física de cada uno. Comer entre comidas no está permitido.
- **Qué significa abstinencia?** Abstinencia significa no comer carne. También dejar de hacer cosas por diversión como espíritu de arrepentimiento.
- **Puede alguien ser excusado del ayuno o la abstinencia?** Alguien que esté enfermo o que tenga alguna razón fuerte pueden ser excusados pero deben compensarlo con oraciones o algún otro tipo de abstinencia.
