*From the Pastor*

*Dear Friends in Christ,*

Over 200 people came to experience Michael Reardon's presentation of the "Gospel of Matthew" on February 24<sup>th</sup>. We had guests from Weatherford, Thomas, and even a busload from St. Ann's Retirement Center. Also, a good number of people who came here from other Christian churches. During the intermission, Patrick Lane, who does the special effects (music, lighting, sound), was swarmed by children who wanted him to show them his tricks. The evening turned out to be a powerful experience with the living Word of God. Those present gave a total of \$1100 to help pay for Michael and Patrick's expenses. Some of the funds raised from this weekend's religious articles sale will also be used to help pay for this presentation. Thanks to Deirdre Hite who coordinated the publicity and hospitality for the "Gospel of Matthew" and to all who helped Deirdre.

Our Fellowship Hall was packed to overflowing on February 26<sup>th</sup> for the Friends of Bolivia Dinner and Auction. 900 Italian sausages had been made and cooked for the event, and there were many wonderful items to bid on in both the silent and live auctions. Our local Knights of Columbus Assembly #2560 puts on this annual event. Thanks to Steve Chastain, chairperson, to my brother Knights, and to the many others who worked so hard to make this annual fundraiser for our Medical Mission to Bolivia such a success. (Next weeks' bulletin will provide the total amount of funds raised.)

Fr. Paul Gallatin, who is pastor of St. Charles Borromeo Parish here in OKC, will lead an hour-long reflection entitled "Healing of Memories" in the church from 7:30 - 8:30 p.m. this Tuesday night. Childcare will be provided. Using music and prayerful meditation, Fr. Gallatin will lead those who attend through a complete review of the significant moments in the journey through life. Many people carry hurtful memories, either of sins they committed against others, or sins that others committed against them. Oftentimes, the way we humans cope with such pain is to bury the memories. The reflection by Fr. Gallatin helps to bring these memories to the healing light of Christ's love, not to erase them from our hearts and minds, but to transform them. Remember, the Risen Christ still carries the wounds of his crucifixion (recall his words to Thomas--place your hand in the nail marks in my hands) but these wounds and his very life have been transformed by his resurrection.

We experience the healing presence of the Risen Christ in a powerful way through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, also called the Sacrament of Penance. As we bring those sins that burden us to the Lord (both sins we have committed and sins committed against us), we find forgiveness. Thus, our Lenten **Communal Penance Rite at 6:30 p.m. this Wednesday** is intimately connected to Tuesday night's "Healing of Memories". A brief Evening Prayer service begins this Communal Rite of Penance, followed by the opportunity for individual confession with one of the 9 priests who will be present. Come and experience the power of the Lord's merciful love in this Sacrament of healing.

Thanks to the 376 donors who have pledged \$98,165 to this year's ADF Appeal. We are still short of our \$115,000 goal, so if you have not made a gift, please take a pledge envelope and prayerfully consider this opportunity to support the many good works of our Archdiocese.

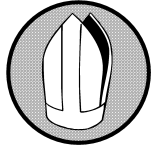

## FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT



THE FOLLOWING DECLARATION WAS SIGNED BY ARCHBISHOP BELTRAN ON BEHALF OF THE ARCHDIOCESE OF OKLAHOMA CITY ON FEBRUARY 1, 2005, ALONG WITH THIRTY FIVE OTHER RELIGIOUS LEADERS.

"We affirm that every human person is created in the image of God and that women are equal inheritors of the inestimable value and dignity bestowed by our Creator on all human persons. We further affirm that the worldwide plague of violence against women in all its forms, including rape, torture, forced abortion, physical and emotional battering and domestic violence, is against the law of God and violates the relationship of mutual friendship, love and support which God intended when He made us male and female.

We hereby pledge as people of faith that we will use the moral voice afforded us by our positions as religious leaders to say clearly and unequivocally that violence against women violates women's God-given dignity as human persons by treating them as objects to be used and violated. We state in the strongest possible terms that violence against women is gravely sinful and cannot be justified.

We encourage our brothers and sisters in faith to join us in offering prayers for an end to violence against women and the beginning of true harmony and love between all men and women everywhere."

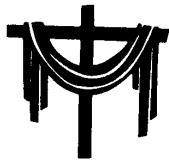

### **REGLAS DE LA CUARESMA**

La ley de la iglesia considera cada viernes y la temporada de Cuaresma como un tiempo de penitencia. La práctica de penitencia es parte de nuestra fe y nuestra vida cristiana. Cuando hacemos penitencia, imitamos a Jesús quién lo recomienda como necesario a sus seguidores y les da el ejemplo de Sus oraciones y abstinencia.

La obligación de la Cuaresma, requiere que se haga ayuno en el miércoles de ceniza y el viernes santo. **Abstinencia de carne se debe hacer el miércoles de ceniza y todos los viernes de Cuaresma.**

- **Quién tiene que ayunar?** Todos los Católicos entre las edades de 18 y 59 años. Esta termina cuando alguien cumple los 60 años.
- **Quién tiene que abstenerse de comer carne?** Todos los Católicos de 14 años en adelante.
- **Qué significa ayunar?** Ayunar significa que solo puede tener una sola comida fuerte al día. Se permite tomar dos comidas ligeras más durante el día si es necesario para mantener la salud o fuerza física de cada uno. Comer entre comidas no está permitido.
- **Qué significa abstinencia?** Abstinencia significa no comer carne. También dejar de hacer cosas por diversión como espíritu de arrepentimiento.
- **Puede alguien ser excusado del ayuno o la abstinencia?** Alguien que esté enfermo o que tenga alguna razón fuerte pueden ser excusados pero deben compensarlo con oraciones o algún otro tipo de abstinencia.
