Several times in the past week I have been asked the same question: "Father, are the Sundays of Lent supposed to count as days of keeping our Lenten penances?" My response--Sundays are always a day set apart, so we are not required to maintain our Lenten penances on Sundays, though people may choose to do so. (Count the days from Ash Wednesday to the end of Lent--there are more than 40 days because Sundays are not included in the count.) This confusion in thinking that Sundays are part of Lent points to a much larger muddling of thinking that has occurred over the past 30-40 years, and that is the role of Sunday in the life of the faithful. Sundays are meant to be a day set apart (holy), a day different from the other 6 days of the week. The 3rd commandment is "Keep holy the Sabbath" and we do so by resting on the Sabbath day and setting aside time to come together with our brothers and sisters and give praise and thanks to God at Mass. My parents taught me the sanctity of Sunday by not only setting aside time to worship but also by discouraging work--neither dad nor mom worked on Sunday and we children could not mow the lawn or do any other work either. It was a day to relax, to enjoy God's creation, to spend time with family and friends. Also, during Lent, whatever we children gave up for the 40 days of Lent we could have on Sundays, for our parents taught us that Sunday truly was a day set apart, a day to celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord. Sadly, for too many people in our culture, which places so much value on doing instead of being, so much value on working instead of resting, so much value on consuming instead of appreciating, Sunday is just another day on a never-ending merry-go-round of days which whirl by and blend into each other.

An example of almsgiving from an unlikely source--an Olympic athlete. Joey Cheek, a US speedskater who won a gold and silver medal, donated his \$40,000 in prize money to a humanitarian organization Right to Play, which is helping the suffering people of Sudan. His moving act of generosity prompted corporations and individuals to get involved, so that Right to Play has received \$350,000 in donations since Cheek's remarkable deed. Almsgiving reminds us that our acts of generosity give birth to other deeds of generosity--love truly is contagious.

In last Sunday's bulletin, there was an insert entitled, "How Do We Know Who Jesus Is?" This is the first of 12 monthly installments in the series entitled, "Jesus: A Historical Portrait." Next month's issue will be "The World Jesus Knew." There are usually extra copies of these fine educational pieces on the countertop in the gathering area.

I will be one of the Spiritual Directors for Women's Cursillo #84 at St. Eugene Church in Weatherford from Thursday evening, March 16 -- Sunday evening, March 19th. (I will be back here briefly on Sunday morning the 19th to celebrate the First Scrutiny with our catechumens (Elect) at the 10 a.m. Mass.)
