Dear Friends in Christ,

For these next 3 Sundays of Lent, we switch from the "B" Cycle of Scripture readings to the "A" cycle. The "A" cycle presents us with the very powerful readings from the Gospel of John that will guide our Elect (catechumens chosen for baptism at Easter) in their celebration of the "Scrutinies" at the 10 a.m. Mass. The Gospel for this Sunday, the story of Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman at the well, reveals not only to the Elect but to all the baptized preparing to renew baptismal promises at Easter those things we drink of which do not quench our thirst for the divine and call us back to Jesus who is "living water," the water of life. Next Sunday the healing of the man born blind causes reflection on those areas in our life where we still walk in darkness and need the light of the Lord. Then on the 5th Sunday of Lent with the raising of Lazarus from the dead we are challenged to examine the tombs we choose to live in and where Jesus, who is the Resurrection and the Life, is calling us from death-dealing attitudes/behaviors to new life.

Two of our parishioners have been recognized by Catholic Charities over the past two years for outstanding service. Mary Diane Steltenkamp, who coordinates the Parish Nurse ministry, received the "Employee of the Year" award at the 2005 meeting. Shirley Cox, who works in Social Action, received the same award this year. Thanks to Mary Diane, Shirley and all the dedicated employees and volunteers at Catholic Charities.

The Bishop McGuinness boys basketball team won the State 4A championship last Saturday evening. Three members of our parish played vital roles in this accomplishment. Andy Wilson is the point guard and spark plug for the team, Alex Fuller came off the bench to make 2 free throws in the final seconds to win the championship game, and Michael Sosayna was named the MVP for the State Tournament. Also, Nicole Shanbour helped lead her girls basketball team at Deer Creek to the 4A State Championship and was named to the All-Tourney team. All of these young people are not only good athletes but also display good sportsmanship and represent our parish very well.

The Lenten Parish Mission is this week. On Wed. night, Fr. Ross will examine the role anger plays in the spiritual life and then Dr. Louis Lepak, director of St. Joseph's Counseling Center, will share his experiences on how to make constructive use of this powerful emotion. I will address "forgiveness" in my talk on Thursday night (how we can forgive not just others, but also forgive ourselves and be more open to God's saving forgiveness) and then Mrs. Katie Gordy, pastoral associate at St. Monica's, will offer examples from her own life about the healing power of forgiveness. The Mission concludes on Friday night with a Lenten Penance Service at 7 p.m. A meal will be served each night of our Mission from 6-7 p.m.
