from the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends in Christ,

With today's celebration of Palm Sunday we enter into the holiest week of the year. For many college basketball fans, this is a big week because of the games being played by the "Sweet 16." For Catholics, this week has even deeper and more lasting significance than victory at a sporting event—we remember and rejoice in the Son of God's death on the cross and his rising to new life. The liturgies of this week for the Easter Triduum (Holy Thursday through Easter Sunday) plunge us into the paschal mystery that is being played out in the Church right now, as we are joined to the dying of Christ that we might rise with him to new life.

This Friday, which is Good Friday, we are called to fast and abstain from meat. However, the fasting we do on Good Friday is different from any other Lenten fasting, for Lenten fasting is penitential. The fast on Good Friday falls during the Triduum and is like the fasting we do before a big event when we are simply too excited to eat much at all, such as our wedding day or other major event. This fast is an anticipatory fast, which actually stretches into Holy Saturday in preparation for the Great Easter Vigil, the most important liturgical celebration of the entire year. The catechumens and candidates are full of excitement as they make last-minute preparations for their reception of the Easter sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation at the Vigil, in order to become full members of the Church. We who are already full members of the Church fast with them as we prepare for the most beautiful liturgy of the year: when Christ our light destroys the darkness of death, when we will feast on the wonder-filled stories of our salvation, when we will see the Risen Christ rising up in those baptized into him and His Spirit falling upon the newly received, when we will come to the table of the Lord Jesus and see him present among us in the breaking of the bread.

The collection on Holy Thursday is for the "Rice Bowl" project of Catholic Relief Services (CRS) which helps feed and care for our impoverished brothers and sisters throughout the world. The donation our parishioners gave CRS to help with the tsunami victims was incredibly generous. However, millions of children die from hunger and disease each year—a silent tsunami that never makes the evening news. On Good Friday the collection is for the support of the Franciscan Ministries in the Holy Land, helping maintain the sacred places, and educational and charitable institutions in the Holy Places of Christ's life and death.

For the past 6 Friday evenings in Lent, various parish groups have generously provided a Lenten meal and also led the Stations of the Cross. Thanks to the following groups who did such a good service: Knights of Columbus, Youth Group, Seniors Group, Ms. Hudman's 8th graders & PTO, Altar Society, and Hispanic Council.

I am still surprised that some people do not know about our 5:30 p.m. Mass on Sunday evening. A number of our teenagers attend this Mass but it is not restricted to the young—all are invited and welcome.

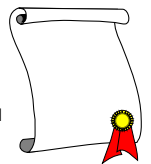

Rev. Dr. Tadeusz Pacholczyk, a priest of the Diocese of Fall River, Mass., has a Ph.D. in Neuroscience, Yale University, where he focused on cloning genes for neurotransmitter transporters, which are expressed in the brain. He also worked for several years as a molecular biologist at Massachusetts General Hospital/Harvard Medical School. He has testified before members of the Massachusetts and Wisconsin State Legislatures during deliberations over a bill to ban human cloning. He has given presentations and participated in round tables on stem cells, cloning and other biotechnologies throughout the United States and Europe.
