The 4th Sunday of Lent is also known as "**Laetare Sunday**." The Latin word "*laetare*" means "*rejoice*," and we do rejoice this Sunday because the Easter mystery draws near. We signify this joyful anticipation with more festive liturgical vestments for the presider, with more music (this Sunday we will add a recessional song), and even with flowers at the altar. All these changes on this "joyful" Sunday are meant to encourage us, reminding us that the goal is not far away, that Easter draws near.

In last weekend's bulletin there was a signed letter by Archbishop Beltran, Bishop Slattery of Tulsa, and the Oklahoma Episcopal and Evangelical Lutheran Bishops asking us to express our opposition to the current immigration reform legislation that is making its way through the House and Senate chambers at our State Capitol. Also included in last week's bulletin was an article by Fr. Don Wolf, former Vicar of Hispanic Ministry and presently pastor at Assumption Church in Duncan, laying out the reasons why such punitive legislation should be opposed. (*Extra copies of these documents are available on the countertop near the main entrance.*) I realize that this is a complex issue with no easy answers, but I do know that the legislation being proposed is not the answer. Besides the very punitive nature of the bills being proposed here in Oklahoma, another problem with these bills at our State Capitol is they do not address just ways to help those who have already lived and worked here for many years to legalize their status. The U.S. Bishops have spent the past year calling for comprehensive immigration reform. You can learn more about their position at their website "*Justice for Immigrants*" at <http://www.justiceformigrants.org>. This website also has plenty of very helpful facts about the immigration issue. The challenge we Christians face is how to best fulfill Christ's command, "*When you welcome the stranger, you welcome me.*" (Matthew 25: 38-40).

Please continue to keep JoAnn Neihart, the rectory cook and housekeeper, in your prayers. She is now recovering at her home from her knee replacement surgery.

I will be leaving this Sunday afternoon for Crested Butte, Colorado, for some fun on the ski slopes. I will be driving and will stop at Guymon on the way back on Monday, April 3rd to help Fr. Pruett with his Lenten Penance Rite. So, I will back here by Tuesday afternoon, April 4th. Fr. Ross will be here in my absence. Fr. Price Oswalt will preside at the Spanish Mass on Sunday, April 2nd.

Daylight Savings Time begins next Sunday, April 2nd, so "spring" forward by setting your clock ahead one hour before going to bed on Saturday night.

Hurricane Relief Continues in Biloxi ...and we need your help!

The Catholic Office of Long Term Recovery just leased a camp ground in Biloxi and is able to house additional volunteers. It is in a beautiful location right on the water and can house approximately 200 volunteers. Currently the office is in need of two types of laborers to support this increased volunteer effort.

Assistance is needed in identifying volunteer cooks who could come for up to two weeks at a time. Also needed is assistance in recruiting volunteer electricians, plumbers, carpenters, drywall hangers and finishers. At this point skilled volunteers are needed to help guide the work of the other volunteers. Ideally, they are asking that volunteers commit for up to 10 days.
