Pastor's desk*

Dear Friends in Christ,

We have spent the past 9 days praying in a very special way for the repose of the soul of Pope John Paul II. I would like to thank all who have helped with the many different prayer services during this novena. Pope John Paul II, in his almost 27 years as Pope, took his title of "Holy Father" seriously, as he reached out to people throughout the world with the message of Christ's love and mercy. He was the first Pope to pray in a Jewish synagogue, a Buddhist temple, and a Muslim mosque. His love for people shone forth in his teachings and in his personal interactions. This Pope had the unique capacity to communicate with people from all over the globe because of his talent for speaking many different languages. Pope John Paul II taught us the inherent, God-given dignity of every human being and how we are all children of one Father--our Heavenly Father. Thus, his perspective was much bigger than any one nation, his perspective broader than the Catholics of any one country—his vision encompassed the world and what was best for people of the entire world.

Therefore, Pope John Paul II challenged our country on the Iraqi war. He cautioned our president to use the bloody weapons of war only after every other peaceful means of resolving conflict had been exhausted, which Pope John Paul II believed did not happen in the decision to go to war in Iraq. The day before the Pope died, a special presidential commission released a scathing report on the failures of our intelligence services regarding the reasons for going to war in Iraq. The report stated that in almost every case the reasons given for going to war were "dead wrong"---sadly the wrong done has resulted in many dead, not only our own beloved soldiers, but also tens of thousands of Iraqis. Pope John Paul II warned our leaders that "war is a defeat for all humanity." Remember, the Iron Curtain came down peacefully partly because of the courageous persistence of Pope John Paul II.

Next weekend the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated at every Mass. Also, next weekend a special collection for "Friends of Bolivia" will be taken up to help fund the medical mission that our parish is sponsoring at the end of May. Don't forget about the annual meeting for Catholic Charities, which will take place tomorrow with Mass at 4 p.m. here in the church and a reception afterward in our parish hall.

Thanks to Cindy Nigg, who spent many hours organizing Late Nite Catechism, and to the many people who helped Cindy pull off this fun event. Three hundred people enjoyed many good laughs as "Sister" jogged our memories with her humorous catechism class. Next week's bulletin will have the final totals as far as monies raised from this event. A special thanks to the sponsors who helped fund such a fun evening.

As of the end of March, donations to the Annual Archdiocesan Appeal (ADF) surpassed our parish goal of \$115,000. Thanks to those of you who gave so generously to this year's ADF fund drive.
