Dear Friends in Christ,

Welcome to our guests on this joyful day and a special welcome to any of our Catholic brothers and sisters who may be coming back to church for the first time in a long time. Today we begin the Easter Season, a celebration that lasts more than one day, because to celebrate the Resurrection we need an entire Season of the Church Year. Rita Ferrone in *Sourcebook for Sundays and Seasons* writes the following about this grand celebration that stretches from Easter Sunday through Pentecost. "The Church in her wisdom gives us forty days of fasting, but fifty days of feasting. This tells us something important about the Christian faith: it is more about joy than about sorrow. The victory of the Resurrection surpasses the power of sin. Christ has not just won the battle. He has vanquished the foe...(and) the scales henceforth are always tipped in favor of humanity... Christ's Passion, death, and Resurrection have won us back. A new life opens before us. Fifty days of feasting is hardly enough time to celebrate this overwhelming gift."

So, the Easter Season is the perfect time to celebrate First Holy Communion and Confirmation. On Tuesday evening, April 25th, Archbishop Beltran will confirm our high school students who have been spent 2 years preparing to receive the seal of the Holy Spirit. At all the Masses on May 6-7, our 2nd Graders will receive First Holy Communion. Other special celebrations fall naturally during this season of great joy. The 8th graders at our parish school will celebrate their graduation at the 5 p.m. Saturday evening Mass on May 20th. The following evening at the 5:30 p.m. Sunday Mass on May 21st, we will honor all of the graduating seniors in our parish and then host a special dinner for them after Mass.

Just as the Easter Season begins with a big celebration on Easter Sunday, so it also ends on a high note, with the great festival of Pentecost. Pentecost falls this year on Sunday, June 4th, which also happens to be the day we will have our annual Parish Picnic to celebrate our Patron Saint. (The feast of Pope St. Eugene is actually on June 2nd --- the 4th of June is the nearest Sunday to celebrate our patronal feast day as a parish family.)

I will be going to my parents' home in Lone Grove on Easter Sunday evening to be with my parents and other family members. I will return here late Easter Monday evening, then fly out early Easter Tuesday morning to Atlanta for the annual National Catholic Education Association (NCEA) Conference. (Almost all of the teachers and staff from our school will be attending this national conference.) I will return from Atlanta this Friday in the late afternoon. Fr. Ross will be here during this first week of Easter, except for Thursday and Friday, but there will be a priest from the Apostles of Jesus community to celebrate Daily Mass on those two days.
