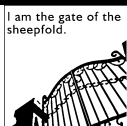

*Dear Friends in Christ,*

With the Pope's recent suffering and death, we have heard a lot through the media about the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick**. Some commentators erroneously called this sacrament, "Extreme Unction," which is the name it was given before the revision of this sacrament as a result of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vatican Council. This sacrament is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. By the sacred anointing and the prayer of its presbyters, the whole Church commends the sick to the suffering and glorified Lord so that he may raise them up and save them. So, those members of the faithful whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age may receive this sacrament. The sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after being anointed and then again falls ill or if during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious. A sick person may be anointed before surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery. Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened, even though no serious illness is present. Sick children may be anointed if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by this sacrament. Thus, those who have a serious physical illness (cancer or any related serious disease) or a serious mental illness are proper candidates for this sacrament, as are elderly people whose advancing age has weakened them. **The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick gives the grace of the Holy Spirit to those who are sick: by this grace the whole person is helped and saved, sustained by trust in God, and strengthened against the temptations of the Evil One and against anxiety over death.** Thus the sick person is able not only to bear suffering bravely, but also to fight against it and know that the Lord Jesus is with them in a special way to give them strength and courage. A return to physical health may follow the reception of this sacrament if it will be beneficial to the sick person's salvation. **When the Church cares for the sick, it serves Christ himself in the suffering members of his Mystical Body.** When it follows the example of the Lord Jesus, who "went about doing good and healing all" (Acts 10:38), the Church obeys his command to care for the sick (see Mark 16:18). This weekend at all the Masses we show our care for the sick as we pray for them and celebrate this sacrament. (These reflections on the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick are taken from the book, *The Rites of the Catholic Church as Revised by the 2<sup>nd</sup> Vatican Ecumenical Council.*)

This Tuesday, April 19<sup>th</sup>, is the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the bombing of the Murrah Federal Building. There will be a special Mass to commemorate this anniversary at 8:15 a.m. on Tuesday morning with the school children participating, but all parishioners are invited. At this Mass, the members of the Village police and fire departments will also be honored.

This Friday night, April 22<sup>nd</sup>, Archbishop Beltran will celebrate Mass at 7:30 p.m. and confirm 30 of our youth. These young people have spent the past 2 years studying and praying in a special way in preparation for receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation. Please keep them in your prayers this week.

At all the Masses on the weekend of April 30 and May 1<sup>st</sup>, the celebration of First Holy Communion for our 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students will take place. At the 5:00 p.m. Mass on Saturday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>, a few older children will make their First Holy Communion, and then at the Spanish Mass on Sunday, April 24<sup>th</sup>, a large number of older children will receive the Body and Blood of the Lord for the first time.

**Inserted in this week's bulletin is a prayer for the election of a new pope.** Please use this prayer during the coming days as the College of Cardinals gather in the Sistine Chapel to choose a new Pope. The conclave begins Monday, April 18<sup>th</sup>. Also, some of you have asked for a copy of the homily that I gave at our Memorial Mass for Pope John Paul II on Friday, April 8<sup>th</sup>. That homily is now posted on the website.
