*Dear Friends in Christ,*

This weekend our **older children** who have been preparing for 1<sup>st</sup> Communion will celebrate this Sacrament at most of our Masses, with a majority of the children doing so at the Spanish Mass. Next weekend at all the Masses our 2<sup>nd</sup> graders will receive Holy Communion for the first time.

As we continue to celebrate the addition of new members to our Church from the Easter Vigil, a reminder that the Catholic Church is still the largest church body in our country. According to the National Council for Churches "2006 Yearbook of American and Canadian Churches," our Church lists 67,820,833 members. (The 2006 yearbook reports numbers for 2004 in comparison with 2003, so our Church membership increased nearly 1% from 2003). The next largest is the Southern Baptist Convention at a little over 16 million members, less than ¼ of our size. Living in the Bible belt we Catholics in Oklahoma are often not aware of how many Catholics there are in the U.S. That's why it is good for our youth to be able to participate in national conventions, work camps, and other activities that open their eyes to these numbers. I can still see the young man in Altus who returned from the National Youth Convention one year to inform me with wide eyes, "Father, I never knew there were so many Catholic girls in the entire world." The really striking number to me in this annual report is the number of Americans who are not listed as being affiliated with any church body at all, for the 219 national church organizations list a combined membership of 163 million Americans. So, there are millions of our fellow Americans who long for the Good News that we have to share, which is an essential part of our duty as witnesses to the Risen Lord.

Our **Parish Assessment and Renewal (PAR)** process continues to move forward under the guidance of our **Parish Oversight Committee (POC)**, chaired by Jerry Rakosky. The other members of our POC are Alberto Aguirre, Karen Bernardy, Cathy Carr, Tresia Miller, Randy Miller, Kelly Milner and Bill Thomas. These committee members are overseeing a process of information-gathering and self-assessment, so we can reflect on the present state and the future direction of the parish prior to the September on-site visit by the PAR team. The survey that was mailed last month to a random selection of 300 parishioners is part of this information-gathering. If you received a survey and have not yet returned it, know that it is not too late to turn in your survey. The POC members are currently placing each parish ministry in one of the following five groups: **Worship, Community Life, Education, Outreach, and Administration.** The next step in our self-assessment process will be to seek input from the leaders of all our ministries, who will meet with other members of their specific group, providing feedback on the strengths and needs of their ministry area. If you have any questions about PAR, talk with me, or visit with Jerry or any of the members of the POC.

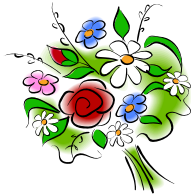

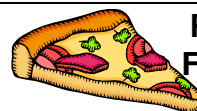
