FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends in Christ,

The 2nd graders in our parish who have been preparing for their First Holy Communion receive the Body and Blood of Christ for the first time at this weekend's Masses. As we pray with these children and see their excitement about receiving Holy Communion, we are reminded of the great gift that the Eucharist is for us. You will find a list of the names of the First Communicants on an insert in this week's bulletin, along with the names of their catechists. Our Director of Religious Education, Mrs. Karen Bernardy, has spent a lot of time and energy ministering to these young ones and to their parents, and she especially deserves our thanks for overseeing their preparation for this joyful day.

The annual basketball game between the 8th grade boys in our school and their fathers (and this Father) will be at 7 p.m. this Sunday night, May 1st in the gym. Monies raised go to the School Scholarship Fund. Last year the game went into overtime before the "fathers" finally won. The fans enjoyed the game even more than the players—our soreness wore off after a few days.

The special 2nd Collection taken up on April 16-17th for the Friends of Bolivia Medical Mission Trip, along with other donations that have since been given, come to a total of \$4035. Thanks to those of you who have supported this important outreach of our parish. I will have the privilege of going on this year's mission trip at the end of May. If you would like to make a donation in support of this year's mission trip, please use the envelopes found in the gathering area.

Next Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Ascension as the Easter Season enters its final days. Next Sunday is also Mother's Day and the annual Archdiocesan collection for Birth Choice. (The Birth Choice envelope is one of the special envelopes in your envelope packet—you can place this envelope in with the regular collection.) Birth Choice is a pro-life, total resource center offering the means and opportunity for women to choose life in a crisis pregnancy. The new center for Birth Choice in OKC at 4701 S. Western will be dedicated on Mother's Day afternoon. Birth Choice also provides services at 11 other locations: Ardmore, Bethany, Edmond, Elk City, El Reno, Guthrie, Lawton, Norman, Ponca City, Purcell and Woodward.

As we prepare to celebrate Mother's Day, let us also remember Mary, the Mother of God and Mother of the Church. May is called the "month of Mary," and I know she is with us, her children, in a special way as we enter into the many joyful celebrations that this month holds: First Communion, Mother's Day, graduations, and other special events.

On Sat., April 30th (not the 23rd), Mrs. De Schmidt of our parish was honored as "Women of the Year" from our parish at an annual recognition ceremony at the St. John the Baptist in Edmond (not the Cathedral) with other Catholic women from other parishes.

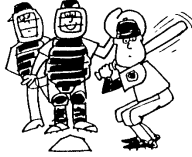

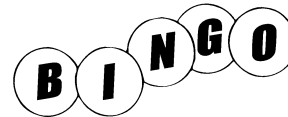
