*Dear Friends in Christ,*

Last Saturday evening and Sunday as I witnessed with great joy our children coming forward to make their First Holy Communion, I could not help but think about how parents lay down their lives for their children. It's one of those times where I wished I could have gone back and added that line to my homily, for the Gospel was about the Good Shepherd laying down his life for his sheep. As the children came forward to receive the Body of Christ, I could not help but notice their parents right behind them, many of them with tear-filled eyes on such a moving occasion. All the loving sacrifices that parents make in laying down their lives for their children shine forth in such beautiful moments as First Communion. On this day, as we honor our mothers and give thanks for the many sacrifices of love they have done for us, I am grateful for all parents, whether mother or father, who embrace such an important vocation that is such a great blessing and a great responsibility.

On the weekend of April 29-30, I used an example in my homily of a child that had been adopted by some good friends of mine. I said that "she will forever carry the wound of not being wanted by her birth mother or birth father." Some parents who have adopted children reacted strongly to the phrase "not being wanted," informing me that they never say that to their adopted children and always try to convey to their adopted children how much they are wanted and deeply loved. I know this to be true and am sorry if I offended any parents or adopted children, for that was not my intent. I only wanted to convey the reality that some adopted children may at one time or another in their life have to wrestle with the "feeling" of not being wanted by their birth parents. The context of the statement in my homily was how this adopted girl had experienced new life in her adopted family and by their love had experienced her wound being healed. I have seen this to be true through my friends love for their adopted children, and through the parents in our parish who have adopted children and laid down their lives for them in love.

The 8<sup>th</sup> grade class at our parish school will celebrate their graduation as they will receive their diplomas at the 5 p.m. Mass next Saturday, May 20<sup>th</sup>. At the 5:30 p.m. Mass on May 21<sup>st</sup> we will pray in a special way for our graduating high school seniors and then have a dinner after Mass in their honor. On the weekend of May 27-28 the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated at all the Masses.

The children who take part in the Children's Liturgy of the Word at the 5 p.m. Vigil Mass on Saturday and the 10 a.m. Mass on Sunday enjoy reflecting on the Scriptures on their level.
