Dear Friends in Christ,

Though the Easter Season officially concluded last Sunday with Pentecost, the spirit of that Season spills over into the two Sundays following Pentecost. After rejoicing in the resurrection of Christ and our share in His Risen Life through the gift of the Holy Spirit, we reflect this Sunday on the nature of God as Trinity: Father, Son, and Spirit. Next Sunday is also a day of special celebration, as we rejoice in the great gift of the Body and Blood of Christ (**Corpus Christi**).

This weekend we celebrate significant milestones in the lives of our young people, with 8th grade graduation at the 5 p.m. Sunday Vigil Mass (Saturday evening) and special prayers and recognition of our high school graduates at the 10 a.m. Mass. For those who have guests from other Christian churches attending these Masses, please remind your guests that the reception of Holy Communion is open only to those Catholics in good standing with the Church. When we say, "Amen," to the minister's proclamation, "Body of Christ," we are saying not only that we believe that this truly is the Body of Christ, but that we also share the same beliefs as the others who partake in this holy meal—we are in "Communion" with them. Sadly, we are not yet to the point of being in full "Communion" with other Christian churches. Though we share many beliefs in common, we do not share everything in common, so Holy Communion at Catholic churches is restricted only to Catholics in good standing with the Church. The same holds true when we attend other Christian Churches---we Catholics are not supposed to share in their Communion, because we are not yet one with them in our beliefs.

At all the Masses last weekend I spoke about an appeal called "**Centennial Challenge.**" In this centennial year of the founding of the Diocese of Oklahoma, we need to raise \$100,000 to solve our cash-flow problems. I shared last weekend that we are right on budget with our Sunday collections and expenses, but we have collected \$40,000 less this fiscal year through the Building for Millennium contributions than last fiscal year. That amount accounts for almost all of the \$38,000 shortfall in income that you see below in the weekly contribution report. We pay a little over \$15,000 monthly on our long-term debt, and the budgeted payments (including capital and interest) for this entire fiscal year are \$191,000. Whenever we do not collect enough money through the Building for Millennium envelopes, then monies from the regular Sunday collection have to be used to pay our long-term debt. As of today, our long-term debt stands at \$646,000. I am grateful to those parishioners, who even though they completed their pledge when the Building for the Millennium appeal ended in the summer of 2002, have continued to give to this fund. However, this year we have received less to this fund than in the past couple of years. Several parish families have committed to give \$50,000 toward our "Centennial Challenge" goal, and I ask the rest of you to consider a sacrificial gift. You can use your Building for the Millennium envelope in your offertory envelope packet or a blank envelope---just write "Centennial Challenge" on whatever envelope you use and place it in the regular Sunday collection or drop it by the parish office.

The generosity of the people of our parish continues to be a blessing not only to our parish but also to the wider Church. For this year's Archdiocesan Appeal, our parishioners have pledged \$132,500---only Christ the King (OKC) and St. John the Baptist (Edmond) pledged more to this year's appeal.

I will leave for Bolivia this Friday, May 27th, to take part in the annual Medical Mission that our parish sponsors. I will **return** late Friday night, **June 3rd.** Fr. Bill Ross will be here in my absence.
