I hope you have enjoyed the bulletin inserts on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of the month written by Daniel Harrington, S.J., on "**Jesus: A Historical Portrait.**" I myself have found them interesting and well done. This month's article presents Jesus as the Teacher who used parables to engage the imagination of his listeners and also discussed is the Sermon on the Mount. Next month's issue will be on the miracles of Jesus and should be thought-provoking.

We have a need for more handicapped parking during the weekend Masses. So, just recently 6 more reserved parking spaces were added--2 outside of the western entrance to the church in the school parking lot and 4 spaces in front of the main church entrance in the north parking lot. The signs in front of these parking spaces are labeled: "*Mass Only—space reserved for the disabled.*"

From Memorial Day through Labor Day the Wednesday prayer events run on a different schedule.

There is still adoration all day after the 6:30 a.m. Mass, but Evening Prayer and Benediction (or Reposition) takes place at an earlier time—7:00 p.m. Instead of having Confessions from 12:30-1:30 p.m. and Anointing of the Sick at 3 p.m. every Wednesday, these Sacraments are only offered on the First Wednesdays of the month for June-August. (Confessions are still heard every Saturday from 3-4 p.m.) If you need to be anointed or need to make an appointment for Confession, please do not hesitate to call the parish office. **Also, whenever school is out** (Christmas break, Spring break, Summer vacation) the **8:15 a.m. Mass on Thursday moves into the chapel.**

The May issue of the "Gospel Truth" was mailed the last week of May, but the heading on the first page said it was the June issue. This was a mistake. The June issue will be mailed out toward the end of this week.

I will attend the annual gathering of priests for Clergy Days at St. Gregory's this Monday night through Thursday at noon. Stephen Covey's "7 Habits of Highly Effective People" will be examined from the particular perspective of priestly ministry. Fr. Ross will be here while I am gone.
