**DEAR PADRE,**

**Was God vengeful in the Old Testament?**

I have studied the Old Testament and found parts where God was rewarding the ancient Jews for killing their enemies. I cannot believe this of a kind and loving God. Is the Old Testament inaccurate?

Dear Jane,

The Old Testament is accurate, but sometimes our understanding is not. Most of us read a Bible that has been translated into our own language. We understand the words according to the common meaning of our time. We look at the situations and descriptions through the lens of our modern culture. Most of the time, this serves us very well, but not always.

The Church tells us that we must know what the authors wanted to affirm and what God wanted to reveal, if we want to understand sacred Scripture. Further, the authors speak through their own culture and use words with meanings common to their own time. The Old Testament narrates events over many centuries. God was forming his people and always acted in love and concern for them. There can be parts of the Old Testament that shock us. We have the full revelation of God, though, in Jesus. The people of the Old Testament were still waiting for the fullness of revelation. We accept the Scriptures as the inspired word of God, even when we do not understand some parts, or, when what we read portrays God in a way we do not understand.

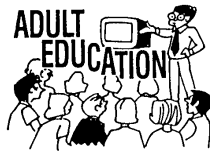
