Dear Padre,

Should Announcements be read at Mass?

I am totally frustrated when our priest goes on forever with announcements at the end of Mass. All of the announcements are in the bulletin to begin with. I feel held hostage, but what can be done without offending him? He is one of the nicest people I have ever met, but I am angry by the time I leave Mass.

Please help.

Dear Marie,

You are probably a good judge of what will offend him. Fortunately, you like him, and this may be something you have to endure. Your letter may help, but your pastor may feel he has no choice about how to handle the announcements. At the end of Mass, we want to make those announcements that are of some importance. If we announce everything in the bulletin, then people just stop listening. I imagine the custom has developed in your parish of people being able to request announcements and expect their request will be honored. Everyone gets equal time. The *General Instruction on the Roman Missal* says that brief announcements may be made after the prayer after Communion, if they are needed (n. 166). That can be a foundation for changing the practice of announcing everything, and taking a long time to do it. There may be others who are frustrated as you are. If you do not wish to tell the priest of your frustration, there is little you can do for the situation. You might pray for guidance, though, about how to bring it to his attention. He may be so used to this he does not know how annoying it is.

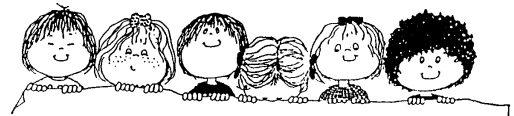

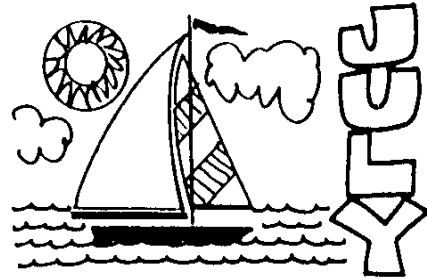
**Catholic Junior High Football Program**
