Dear friends in Christ,

Today the Lectionary interrupts Mark's narrative to insert a series of readings from Chapter 6 in the Gospel according to St. John, the "Bread of Life" discourse. Of the four evangelists, Mark has written the shortest Gospel, and the liturgical year requires some additional readings to fill out the weeks remaining. But John's "Bread of Life" discourse is more than mere filler, because John illuminates the meaning of the Eucharistic feast of Christ's abiding presence in an outstanding way. From this Sunday through Sunday, August 27 (with a slight interruption made by the Feast of the Transfiguration next Sunday), we are invited to meditate on something that stands at the heart of the experience of the Church, but always goes beyond our power to grasp: the mystery of the Eucharist.

The Catholic understanding of "Church" is connected in a powerful way to our understanding of Baptism and Eucharist. We believe that the Church makes Christians, while almost all other Christian denominations believe that Christians make the Church. We believe that Mother Church makes Christians, filling them with the new life of Christ in the waters of Baptism and nourishing that life of Christ at every Eucharistic celebration. Thus, the importance of regular attendance at the Sunday celebration of the Eucharist and the vital role of the community of Faith in making Christians the living Body of Christ. In today's Gospel, the disciples think there is too little to feed the large crowd, but Jesus knows there is more than enough when it is broken and shared. The scandal of people going hungry in our own state, nation, and across the world is that there is more than enough to go around when it is broken and shared. During these weeks of reflection on the "Bread of Life" discourse share your bread with the hungry by bringing donations for our St. Vincent de Paul food closet, or supporting local organizations such as the Regional Food Bank or national organizations such as Bread for the Word (www.bread.org).

This past Friday we celebrated the martyrdom of Fr. Stanley Rother on July 28, 1981. It is no coincidence that a whole new crop of men entered the seminary after Fr. Rother's death to study for the priesthood for our Archdiocese in the mid-1980's. I was one of them. My five ordination classmates of 1991 and I were the largest ordination class since 1954. Fr. Ray Ackerman, son of parishioners Ray and Lou Ackerman, is one of my classmates, and another, Fr. Phil Seeton, served here as associate pastor for several years. A man gives his life and many stand up to take his place.

Our high school youth who attended the leadership conference at Notre Dame earlier this month rated Mark Hart as the best speaker at the conference. Mark will speak at our parish at 7 p.m. next Sunday, August 6. Pray for our youth and their adult sponsors who are in St. Louis this week for Catholic Heart Work Camp.
