Dear Friends in Christ,

Beginning with this issue of the bulletin, you will notice a **couple of new features**. The sponsors whose names/companies are always listed on the last two pages of the bulletin make possible this weekly publication by the purchase of their advertisements. Also, hardly a week goes by without a baptism, wedding, or funeral at our parish, so a new section of our weekly bulletin will contain this information.

Since there was not enough room in the chapel for all the priests, I heard Confessions outside the chapel under a starlit sky. It was a beautiful evening in many ways and a powerful reminder to me of the blessings of our Archdiocesan summer camp program and of the lively and strong faith of our teenagers.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (August 15th) falls on a Monday this year and thus is not a holy day of obligation. Since Fr. Ross will be away on vacation from August 8-19 and Monday is my day off, there will be a Communion Service at 6:30 a.m. in the chapel on Monday morning the 15th.

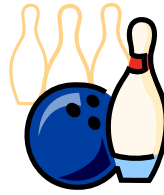

Religious Education classes for all children in grades K-8 of our parish who do not attend St. Eugene School will begin on **Wednesday, September 7.**

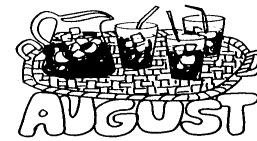
