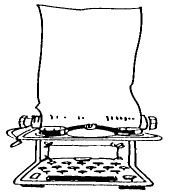

How can I restore my mother's faith?

My mother has been diagnosed with a form of lung cancer. She will be undergoing treatment for the cancer, but I want to help her prepare for the inevitable. My mother is a lapsed Catholic and I want to bring her back into the Church, or at least get her ready for passing.

Can you help me?

Dear Pierce,

This must be a very difficult time for your mother, for you, and for the rest of your family. I will say a prayer for you, and I hope everyone who reads this will offer a prayer for you and your mother. If your mother has friends who attend the Catholic Church, you might encourage them to visit. The visit of friends often gives comfort, but is also a gentle reminder to her of the Church. You might ask her if she would let a priest visit her. You can pray for your mother, and pray with her. There are pamphlets and books you can get for those who are preparing for death that might be a comfort to her. Maybe you can read them to her sometimes if she is too tired to read herself. I think the most important thing, though, is your own presence in her life. She will see your faith and the strength it gives you. That can be a constant reminder that faith can comfort her and prepare her for meeting God. Leave prayer books, prayer cards, and a rosary within her reach. You might be surprised what she does when you are out of the room.
