Dear Friends in Christ,

The Centennial Mass at the Cox Convention Center turned out to be a great celebration of the faith of the Catholic people of Oklahoma. The building was almost full of worshippers from every corner of Oklahoma, even those making the 325 mile trip from Boise City in the Panhandle. The historical video presentation before the Mass set the tone, as we were taken all the way back to 1875 when the first Benedictine monks came to Oklahoma, followed soon after by the Mercy Sisters who opened hospitals and schools. So the seeds of faith were planted long before the Diocese of Oklahoma was officially established in 1905. The Mass was truly a celebration of the diverse cultures making up the Catholic Church in Oklahoma. The opening procession was led by Native American dancers, and the procession with the gifts for the altar was preceded by a special dance by colorfully costumed Vietnamese women. The Mass included prayers offered in Latin, Greek, Spanish, Korean, Vietnamese, Czech, Comanche, and English. The easy-to-follow liturgical programs, with the help of the two large video screens, enabled all gathered to participate fully in the Mass.

Fr. Stephen Bird was the chairman of the Centennial Committee that planned not only the Mass but other events and material related to this Centennial Year. He was ably helped by the members of the Centennial Committee, including one of our parishioners, Anne Coddling. Fr. Bird, Anne, and the other members of this committee spent 2 years working on this project, and the fruits of their labors were very evident in the wonderful celebration this past Sunday. Our music director, Brent McWilliams, helped provide the music, and many of our choir members from our different Mass choirs, including children, sang in the huge choir. Members of our 4th degree Knights of Columbus led the procession and recessional, and of course, we were all very happy to see four of our own receive the special Papal award for the many years of service to the Church: Irene Alsobrook, Marie Downey, Theresa Nagel-Smith, and Ed O'Connor.

I want to obtain a copy of the historical presentation done before the Centennial Mass and make that available to interested parishioners and especially to our children in our school and R.E. program. Also, there are still centennial history books available for purchase in the parish office for \$25, entitled "Roman and Oklahoman: A Centennial History of the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City."

Brent McWilliams had surgery on his neck this past Wednesday --- he has been having pain and numbness in his right hand throughout this past year caused by a pinched nerve. Brent will be recuperating from surgery from August 17-31st. Please keep him in your prayers. He has arranged for other musicians to fill in for him while he is recovering.

Tom Goldsworthy has been accepted into the deacon formation program. He will soon begin the first year of this 4-year program with an entire year of discernment. Please pray for Tom, and his wife, Sandy, and also keep our other deacon candidates in your prayers, for in a little over a year, they will be ordained.

Debbie Bloomquist has been hired as our new Coordinator of Youth and Young Adult Ministry. Debbie will officially begin work here on September 1st. She has been Coordinator of Youth and Young Adult Ministry at Holy Name Catholic Church in Chickasha for the past 8 years. LeAnn Hufnagel, who is presently leading our ministry to youth and young adults, give birth to her first child in September and will become a full-time mom.

Duane and Bernie Hogsett, very active members of our parish, moved to Florida this past week. Keep them in your prayers. Also, the men and women's bathrooms on the west end of the building, across the hall from gym, are now renovated. *In the peace of Christ,*

**PASTORAL MINISTRY PROGRAM,
FALL 2005 SEMESTER SCHEDULE**

The Decree on the Apostate of the Laity of Vatican II says: "As sharers in the role of Christ the Priest, the Prophet, and the King, the laity have an active part to play in the life and activity of the Church The Pastoral Ministry program of the Archdiocese is designed specifically to respond to this call of Vatican II. Theology and ministry courses are offered during Spring, Summer, and Fall semesters for the education and information of persons for ministry in the Church.

Courses may be taken for college credit. **Each 3 hour course costs \$150 + cost of textbooks.** Courses taken for **personal enrichment cost \$90** plus textbooks.
