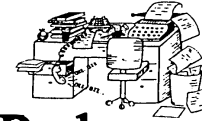

**Dear Padre,**

***Does the Church have a dress code?***

*I am troubled by something I have heard in my church. I am born and raised Catholic and never in my life have I heard anyone tell people not to come to church unless they were "dressed*

*to go to court." I was always told the Lord will accept you as you are. If a person comes to church, should they not be accepted for the faith they have and not the clothes they wear? Padre, if I am wrong please advise, for some reason this worries me quite a bit.*

Dear DDP,

Indeed, people should not be judged based on their clothes. I imagine, though, that this admonition was not given to the homeless who might appear oddly dressed, but to those who have many

choices about what to wear. I do think it odd that the person who has a suit or dress they can wear to a nice restaurant, appears in church in shorts and flipflops. I have celebrated Mass in well-off parishes where the people were careless about how they dressed, and others where they took care about what

they wore. I have celebrated Mass in poor parishes, and never once did any of them appear in anything but the best they had.

Our society is more casual now. Still, there are standards of dress in place. The Catholic parish does not often demand standards of dress in church. They leave it to the good judgment of those involved. As a matter of interest, there is a dress code enforced at Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome. I can understand a pastor who wants people to show their respect for God by what they wear, especially if they have a large wardrobe from which to choose.

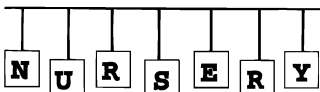
