Dear Friends in Christ,

Art Valdez, chair of the committee that organized last Sunday's "Festival of the Americas: International," the committee members and many workers did a great job with this year's festival. Not only was money raised to support our parish ministries (see "Contribution Report" below) but more importantly people from the many diverse cultures of our parish came together to share their gifts and strengthen their bond as members of the one Body of Christ. Last year the gym was so full of people it was difficult to move from one food booth to the next, so this year another entertainment stage under a big tent was added in the parking lot in front of the school. That not only relieved the congestion in the gym but provided a venue for even more quality entertainment, as entertainers such as Edgar Cruz performed on the outdoor stage.

Thanks to all who responded so generously to the special collections for Hurricane Relief --- a little over \$30,000 was donated. In addition, the children at our school emptied their piggy banks and collected \$1672 to help those suffering from this catastrophe. There was an insert in last week's bulletin about what our own Catholic Charities is doing to help the victims of Hurricane Katrina. With the help of Catholic Charities our parish hopes to soon sponsor a family left homeless by this hurricane. In the pages of this bulletin you will find other suggestions on what you can do to help.

This weekend is our annual Catholic Charities Appeal. There is a letter from Archbishop Beltran inserted in this bulletin urging support for this appeal and point out that this annual appeal is different from the Hurricane Relief collections. The donations for Hurricane Relief were sent to Catholic Charities USA, the national headquarters for all the diocesan Catholic Charities organizations. These funds will be distributed to the Catholic Charities in the various dioceses affected by Hurricane Katrina. On the other hand, our own annual Catholic Charities Appeal supports the many good works of Catholic Charities in our Archdiocese of Oklahoma City. Your pledge today will ensure that those who are in greatest need in our archdiocese will receive the help they need. In fact, the gifts that you have made this past year made possible the outreach of Catholic Charities to those families coming here who have lost everything in the hurricane.

A new season of concerts hosted by Virginia Campbell begins today (Sunday) at 3 p.m. in our church. These concerts feature world-class musicians, and parishioners can attend free of charge simply by presenting this parish bulletin. This Tuesday evening the principal from Bishop McGuinness High School, David Morton, will come to our parish to talk to any interested parents about how McGuinness is working to make Catholic high school education affordable. More info on this meeting on the last page of this bulletin. Also, there will be receptions for newcomers to our parish after the 5 p.m. Mass next Saturday evening and after the Spanish Mass next Sunday. If you are a new member of our parish, please come and bring your family. The Finance Committee has finally finished the budget for this fiscal year. The weekly collection target has been set at the same level as last year (\$27,000) and expenses have been cut in order to balance the budget. July and August are usually the leanest months for collections, which is part of the reason the numbers below reflect us lagging behind in budgeted collections. In the October issue of our monthly newsletter, *The Gospel Truth*, there will be a detailed financial report for last fiscal year (July 2004 - June 2005) as well as the budget for this fiscal year. A great help on the income side these past several months were gifts to the "Centennial Challenge" which just recently passed its goal of \$100,000---so after this week that line item under contributions will no longer be listed

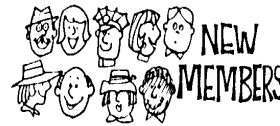

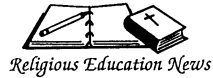
