Dear friends in Christ,

Within the last year natural disasters have caused much suffering on a large scale, from the tsunami in southeast Asia to the hurricanes in our own Gulf Coast region to the recent earthquake in Pakistan. Both individuals and nations have reached out to help those suffering from the effects of these natural disasters. A natural disaster which has not received as much publicity, but has been just as devastating, has been the recent mud slides in Guatemala. **The cantons (neighborhoods) of Panabaj and Tzanchaj have been buried in our former mission parish of Santiago Atitlan.** (For several decades our Archdiocese had one of our own priests pastor the parish in Santiago Atitlan and one of them, Fr. Stanley Rother, was martyred there in 1981.) Hundreds have died and many more have been left homeless by the mud slides--the parish is housing and feeding those displaced by this disaster. In response to this tragedy and because of the close connection our Archdiocese has had over the years with the people of Santiago Atitlan, Archbishop Beltran has established the "Santiago Atitlan Relief Fund." Contributions to this fund can be made through our parish with checks made out to St. Eugene Parish and "Santiago Atitlan Relief Fund" written on the notation line. There will not be a 2<sup>nd</sup> collection for this appeal, so donations can be placed in the regular collection basket or sent to the parish office and then one check from our parish will be sent to the Archdiocese. Archbishop Beltran originally planned to take the \$32,000 collection from the August Centennial Mass to Santiago Atitlan on the pilgrimage in July 2006 as a memorial offering on the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Fr. Rother's death, but in light of this disaster, the Archbishop has sent these funds to the mission immediately.

During this Centennial Year celebration there is still time to make a pilgrimage to one of the holy sites in Oklahoma. Pilgrimage passport books are available on the countertop in the gathering area. **I will be leading a pilgrimage to the holy sites in Spain in June 2006.** At one time in Spain the 3 great faiths who count Abraham as their father coexisted peacefully: Jew, Muslim, and Christian. Also, some of our greatest spiritual sages lived in Spain: Sts. John of the Cross, Ignatius of Loyola, and Teresa of Avila. I will be the main spiritual director for the Men's Cursillo weekend at St. Eugene Church in Weatherford from Thursday evening, October 20 – Sunday evening, October 23<sup>rd</sup>. I will then leave Monday morning the 24<sup>th</sup> on retreat and will return to the parish on Friday evening the 28<sup>th</sup>. Fr. Ross will be here during my absence.
