*Dear Friends in Christ,*

We enter into the first week of our annual Stewardship Renewal with talks by lay people at all the Masses this weekend about how Stewardship has become a way of life for them. Commitment Sunday is next Sunday, November 5<sup>th</sup>. You should receive by mail information on this year's Stewardship Renewal. It is very important to fill out the Commitment Card and recommit to the ministry (or ministries) that you serve in. The past 3 years our parish has been assisted by a consulting company in conducting this renewal, but this year our Stewardship Committee has taken over the entire project.

All Saints Day is this Wednesday. The Mass schedule can be found on this page of the bulletin. Every Sunday when we stand to profess our faith, we proclaim in the Creed our belief in the Communion of Saints. These holy men and women intercede for us constantly and also set an example for us to follow. They give us courage by showing us that the life of faith can be lived and be lived joyfully. The pilgrimage I led earlier this month to Spain made two saints come to life for me, and our pilgrims, in a special way—St. Teresa of Avila and St. John of the Cross.

All Souls Day follows All Saints Day as we pray for all the faithful departed, especially our own beloved dead, that they might know the fullness of life with God in heaven. At the 6 p.m. Mass on Thursday evening, parishioners who have died in the past year will be remembered in a special way, and their family members will be treated to a meal after Mass, compliments of the women of our Altar Society. Also, there will be a book placed in the gathering area for you to write the names of your own beloved dead, and these will be remembered in prayer during the month of November.

A new event this year is a Halloween Carnival and Trick or Treat Night from 6-8 p.m. this Tuesday night in the gym. Debbie Blomquist, Coordinator of Youth and Young Adult Ministry, is organizing this event. Parents bring your children, and if you would like to volunteer, contact Debbie at 751-7115 X 119.
