Marian Jeter, who teaches kindergarten at our school, was named "*Catholic Educator of the Year*" at the annual Catholic Foundation awards gathering on November 17th. Marian has been teaching at our school for 6 years, and has been a Catholic school teacher for 21 years. This is the 2nd year in a row that this prestigious award has been given to an educator at our school. Last year our principal, Suzette Williams, received this award.

The mission of the Catholic Foundation is to further the work of the Church of Oklahoma, especially through education. Thus, each year thousands of dollars in college scholarships are awarded. Grants are also given to parishes to support their education programs. This year our school received a grant in the amount of \$2,500.00 for computers and technology. Also, Debbie Blomquist received a grant in the amount of \$2,000.00 for our Life-Teen Confirmation program to purchase Audio-Visual Equipment.

As a demonstration of **solidarity with Pope Benedict XVI** on the occasion of his **upcoming pastoral visit to Turkey**, November 28 – December 1, the Knights of Columbus are organizing a special "Spiritual Pilgrimage" for its members and all Catholics, which aims to generate prayers for the success of Pope Benedict's trip. While few Catholics will be able to physically travel to Turkey to participate in the Holy Father's visit, the goal of this "Spiritual Pilgrimage" is to unite millions of Knights and other Catholics with the pontiff through their prayers. A special prayer is posted on the Knights website (www.kofc.org) to be prayed from the Sunday prior to the Pope's visit (Nov. 26) through December 1.

A new liturgical year commences next Sunday with the celebration of the 1st Sunday of Advent. We also begin a new cycle of Scripture readings, with **Luke's Gospel** being the **primary Gospel** in the new liturgical year. A number of the most well-known and well-loved stories are only found in Luke, and we will hear them this coming year: the Good Samaritan, the story of Martha and Mary, the Prodigal Son, the rich man and Lazarus, and the story of Zacchaeus. Luke is known by a number of characteristics: the author's emphasis on the Holy Spirit, Jesus' ultimate journey to Jerusalem as a context for the whole Gospel, an emphasis on the marginalized and the outcast, and an emphasis on Gentiles and others who were considered outsiders.
