Dear friends in Christ,

Today we begin the Season of Advent, a special time set aside for preparation for the coming of the Lord. We find ourselves living during the in-between time, after the first coming of the Lord in the flesh and before his second coming in glory. During this in-between time, we are challenged to be attentive to the ways the Lord visits us today, often times in ways that we do not expect. Thus the Gospel for last Sunday (Christ the King Sunday) prepared the way for the celebration of Advent, as Matthew's judgment scene reminded us that whenever we welcome the stranger, we welcome Christ; whenever we care for the sick, we care for Christ; **whenever we feed the hungry, we feed Christ himself.**

We have just finished celebrating Thanksgiving, many of us sitting down to tables bulging with food. However, while we were eating turkey and ham and pumpkin pie, many children and adults went hungry in our country. The shocking scandal in a country as rich and resourceful as ours is that widespread hunger and poverty are tolerated. *More than 36 million people--including 13 million children--live in households that struggle to put food on the table.* (A number of these households contain at least one working adult and are members of a new class in America--the "working poor.") Members of Congress are currently debating budget cuts that would make the situation of hungry children in our land even worse. The fact that nutrition programs, such as food stamps, are threatened by budget cuts at a time of rising hunger and poverty reflects mistaken priorities. Military expenditures (our country spends more in this area than all the rest of the countries in the world combined), along with \$2 trillion in tax cut extensions that benefit mainly the very wealthiest people, are being advocated at the expense of programs that help low-income people care for their families and build better futures. Put simply, war and tax cuts are threatening our country's progress against hunger and poverty.

The teachings of our Church are very clear--governments have a responsibility to protect the most vulnerable in society. Through the tens of thousands of dollars that are so generously given annually to our St. Vincent de Paul Conference to help the least ones in our own community, through the gifts of food to our food pantry, and through our Mobile Meals ministry, our parish is able to help many families who would otherwise go hungry. However, these efforts are just a drop in the bucket compared to the effectiveness of our government's food stamp program. An editorial in the *New York Times* on August 17, 2005, pointed out, "Government studies show that the food stamp program is one of the most vital and tightly run federal services, affording an average subsidy of \$1 per meal." More than half of all food stamp beneficiaries are children; virtually all of the rest are elderly, disabled, or making the transition from welfare to work. Cutting food stamps would be doubly cruel this winter, for heating bills are at an all-time high, forcing families to choose between buying food or keeping the kids warm. Our country must preserve its national nutrition programs and move decisively toward reducing hunger, and we are responsible for keeping this message before Congress

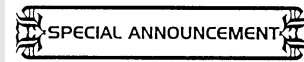

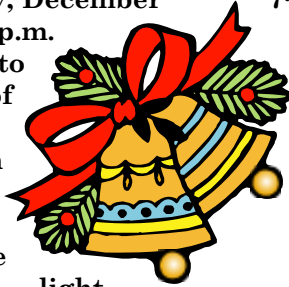
