Dear friends in Christ,

At all the Masses this weekend, I will be commissioning Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion ("Communion Ministers") for our parish. Communion Ministers used to be called "Eucharistic Ministers" but within the past year the Church has changed the terminology to clarify that the Priest is the Minister of the Eucharist, while others (Deacons or Extraordinary Ministers) may assist in the distribution of Communion. Communion Ministers are approved and appointed by the Archbishop. They are mature, practicing Catholics who, ordinarily, are at least eighteen years of age. Communion Ministers have received the Sacrament of Confirmation, and if married, are in a valid marriage. Those converting to the Catholic faith must be active members of the Church for at least 3 years before being considered for this ministry. Finally, the public life of a Communion Minister must reflect the teachings of the Church. After being approved and appointed by the Archbishop, qualified candidates are commissioned by their pastor for a 3-year term of service. (Normally this commissioning takes place on Christ the King Sunday toward the end of November, but our list of qualified candidates was sent in a little late, so we are doing this later this year.) Communion Ministers may be reappointed and re-commissioned every 3 years. So this weekend those to be commissioned will be both new Communion Ministers as well as veterans who are being re-commissioned. Thanks to Paula Fanson who is the coordinator of our Communion Ministers.

Monday we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, patroness of the entire Americas. During the past 2000 years since the birth of Christ, his mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary, has made several appearances (apparitions) in order to prepare the way more readily for the coming of her Son. In these visitations, the Blessed Mother has been given different titles, such as Our Lady of Fatima (in Portugal) or Our Lady of Lourdes (in France). Between December 9-12, 1531, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared several times to Juan Diego on a hill called Tepeyac in what is now modern-day Mexico City. She appeared looking like a young Aztec woman, with the same dark skin as Juan Diego's and speaking his native language. She was pregnant--a sign that she was bringing her Son—and though her dress was European, the decorations on her dress were indigenous. The Blessed Mother imprinted her image upon Juan's tilma (cloak), and this original image can still be seen today in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico City. Her visitation to Juan Diego prepared the way for the native people of Mexico to receive her Son, as thousands upon thousands were baptized in the following decade. The word Guadalupe" means "she will crush the serpent of stone." In and through her, the Spanish and Aztec peoples found a way to unite and become one people under the Blessed Mother, recognizing their dignity as brothers and sisters to her Son and children of the Living God.
